In maths, they have been developing their reasoning skills by answering questions involving polygons. It's been fantastic to see their confidence grow as they tackled these challenges. On Wednesday, we had our muchanticipated Sports Day! The children all did an amazing job, showing great sportsmanship, enthusiasm, and teamwork throughout the day.

Year 6 have been amazing this week. They have written up their Evolution texts based on their English book: Moth.
