This week in school we have.....

This week in Reception, we have been enjoying the story of Stickman. The children explored the different characters in the story and used their own imaginations to create their own characters who could greet Stickman on his adventure! We also talked about Stickman's family and shared discussions about our own families, celebrating what makes each one special. At the end of the week, we celebrated David Attenborough's 100th birthday. The children learnt about the world around us, what's in it and ways in which we can look after and protect our planet. Another fun-filled week!!

This week in Year 1 we have been finishing our final part of Grandad's Island. Looking at how we know what they did on holiday 100 years ago. Identifying wild plants in the woods and starting our fractions work.

This week Year 3 have looked at the work of Cornish artist, Sue Read and taking inspiration from her paintings have created their own seascapes, creating movement and expression in their work to describe the characteristics of the ocean. They also have been learning a song in Cornish as well as exploring different dialects as part of our Year 3 topic about Cornwall.

Year 6 have been busy getting SATs ready. This week they have been finding missing angles and converting percentages, fractions and decimals. They are all in an amazing place for next week and so proud of all their hard work. In science, they have been looking at the Animal Kingdom as part of their classification work. They have also drawn animal and plant cells.

It may have only been a short week but Year 2 have still been super busy! We've enjoyed reading all of *The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark* and produced some fantastic writing. In Maths, we've been recognising quarters and our Science learning involved designing some really cool micro-habitats which we cannot wait to have a go at making in the woods!

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed finding out about the Vikings and discussing the big question: "What image do we have of the Vikings today?"

Is how we imagine the Vikings always historically accurate? We have enjoyed sketching some Viking knots in art - these are very tricky and not as easy as they look - but what a good go Year 4 had.

We are extremely proud of writing in Year 4 this week...having finalised and published out final pieces of writing 'Should animals be kept in zoos?' Everyone has worked exceptionally hard to present these to the highest standard - well done Year 4.

This week in Year 5, we explored the impact of online gaming and discussed how adapting games can help people feel safer online. In RE, we explored the story of Book of Exodus, carefully noting the chapters and verses to help us create a timeline of events. We learned about the Ten Plagues and linked this learning to our value of justice, discussing fairness and consequences. In English, we began planning our own biographies. We researched famous scientists, naturalists, and inspirational people who have made a positive impact on our world.

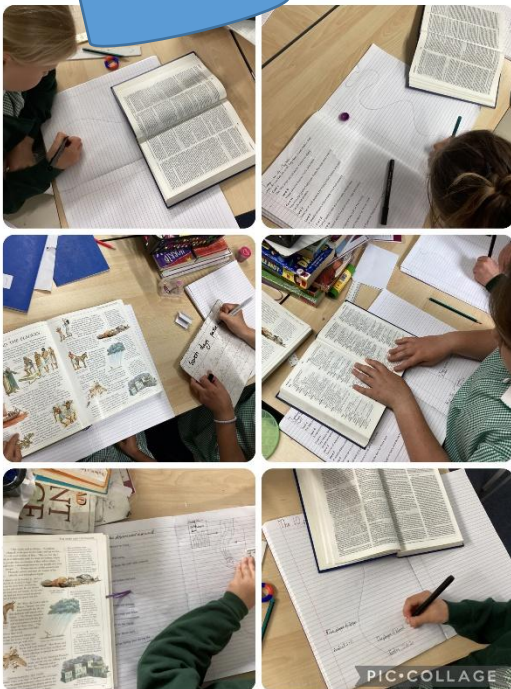
