This week in school we have...

This week Year 2 have been hard at work writing adjectives and continuing to develop their place value skills. They have also learnt a bit more about England, the flag and where it comes from. In RE we have been thinking about the Good news about peace that the bible gives us and making our own hearts. We went into the woods and explored different habitats as well as making the amazing see saw you can see in the picture. It has been a great week. This week Year 1 have been Creating their own Dear Zoo story and enjoying some pirate phonics! They have also been Counting dinosaurs in Maths and exploring their senses in Science inside the Classroom and outside on the playground.

This week in Year 3 the children have been super scientists investigating the properties of rocks and answering a big question around this. They have been writing out Stone-age stories, learning about Hindu worship, making stone-age homes in the woods and enjoying team sports.

This week Reception class had a great time exploring our curiosity cube that we have inside the classroom. It sparked lots of conversation and excitement. Reception class also enjoyed time on the field for their first try of PE with Mr Brown! This week in Year 4 we have been really working hard on place value in maths. We have been using practical apparatus to understand 4-digit numbers. In our English work, we drew our own mythical beasts and used imaginative language to write a description of these. This week's photo is of our 'sound' walk around school to listen out to different things we can hear and understand that sound travels through the air to our ears.

Year & have been looking at electricity and how we can harness greener options of power. We have made our own electrical circuits and can use technical vocabulary to describe key components to make a bulb light up. We also completed our work about Queen Elizabeth II and what qualities are needed to be Head of the Church of England.

Year 5 have been deepening their understanding of place value, working with numbers to one million! They've also been having fun making boring, simple sentences 'come alive' and thinking what qualities they would choose, if they were to build their own God!
