This week Year 3 have been doing some acting in order to learn the story of "How to wash a woolly Mammoth." They have also completed some super addition and subtraction remembering small number facts and honing their mental addition skills. They have loved exploring exciting adjectives and painting their own imaginary worlds in art. We have also found out more about place value and completed our learning on England - including a delicious cream tea! In ICT we have used a painting programme and we have been working hard on our harvest performance.

This week Year 1 have enjoyed looking at each other's baby photos and seeing how much they have changed for our History topic. They have also been enjoying the story, 'The Tiger who came to Tea' and practising writing invitations for their own class tea party. In Maths they have been doing problem solving games and working hard on their number skills.

Reception class have had a VERY busy week. Bagel our class bear was stolen by the evil pea so we have had to make traps and think of ways to catch him to get our bear back, like making our very own Supertatoes! We also had a visit from the fire fighters and got to go in the fire engine and shoot water! Year 6 have been researching scientists and how they changed the World with electricity. They produced timelines showing scientific breakthroughs and looked at alternative sources of power. We were very reflective about caring for our environment and how politics affect source and supply.

This week, Year 4 have had a fun week with lots of hands-on learning - especially in maths. We carried out a round robin of practical place value activities to help our understanding of this concept. We have also been finding out about different varieties of unicorns in English - we are intrigued to learn more. Earlier in the week, we had a lovely music session learning a song we have been thinking about in RE what a wonderful group of singers we are.

Year 5 have been furthering their understanding of place value up to 1 million; have been turning mundane sentences into blow-you-away sentences in history; learning about and singing ostinatos for our harvest performance and investigating a map of Britain from 1500 years ago to today!
