After winning their first 2 matches last week, this week we drew 2-2 with Menheniot and then lost 2-1 to a very strong Liskeard-Hillfort team.

### This week in school we have...

This week in Reception Class the children have been very motivated by their dinosaur focus. They have explored a range of fossils and examined them with magnifying glasses. They have drawn pictures of themselves as dinosaurs and made up funny dinosaur names! They have talked about why people in our class are special in RE  $\bigcirc$  This week Year 5 have worked brilliantly to complete their science topic on forces. Inspired by the interesting inventions in Wallace and Gromit, the children were challenged to design a crazy invention which used levers, pulleys and gears. In our RE session, children have explored why the Torah is so special to the Jewish and they looked at how this was treated with such respect. We've also had a super week writing fabulous sentences in English and are really working hard with adding and subtracting fractions in maths.

This week Years 3 have been working in pairs using maths resources to solve division problems, discovering how and why the River Nile was important to the Egyptians and designing their own Egyptian neck collar as part of our topic about ancient Egypt.

This week Year 2 have been continuing to write their story about Mabel and they have looked at commas carefully. In maths they have been adding and subtracting and using bigger numbers. They were awesome scientists dissecting beans and finding out what the important parts were. They have been continuing to explore printing and made some amazing potato prints. Another very busy week! This week in Year 4, we've been busy creating some fantastic river poems, coming up with some truly creative rhymes! In PSHE, we've been discussing how to cope with disappointment when our dreams and goals change and learning some helpful strategies to stay positive. We've also explored the Hindu belief that Brahman is present in everything, and how this belief can influence the way people live their lives.

> This week Year 6 have been sharing their 5 most precious things they would take with them on a journey with the class, and telling us why they chose those items. They thought carefully about why and showed great maturity with their answers. We have also been working in groups to create a map of Baghdad using only written clues. Will they complete their task? Watch this space!

This week in Year 1 we have been writing our own poems and looking at how numbers within 20 are made and written. We baked and tried Challah bread whilst learning about Shabbat. We have also continued looking at Captain Scott's journey to the South Pole and much more.
