They have also created some colourful African art with pastels and in Science sorted different native creatures into categories including mammals and amphibians.

This week Year 4 have been using watercolour paints to colour in their mythical scenes. We have been writing about Characters and settings in English and in Maths we've been continuing our work on decimals.

Year 6 have been working hard on their biographies this week, learning how to research, plan and construct a biography of someone who inspires them. They have also been preparing for our VE party next week - the newspaper bunting looks great!
