## This week in school we have.....

This week in Reception class, we made the most of the beautiful sunshine by going on a walk around the school grounds to spot the signs of spring. Everyone loved noticing all the changes happening around us! In RE, we designed our own El Salvador style crosses to show what happened on Palm Sunday and used oil pastels to make their artwork bold, bright and full of colour. We also had a great time celebrating World Book Day where we enjoyed sharing our favourite stories and participating in various activities throughout the day.

This week Year 3 have begun a new RE topic exploring Muslim festivals and family life. They have been thinking about times when Muslims need to trust in Allah, which has linked nicely with our school value of Trust. In Maths we have continued exploring fractions, making connections with food. For Geography we have been learning about features of cities, towns and hamlets, and in Science we are investigating plants, learning about what they need to survive and thrive.

The class also had great fun on World Book Day dressing up as their favourite characters and joining in with lots of literacy based activities with all of the juniors.

Year 6 have been busy literally travelling through time. They have been calculating how to convert analogue to digital and working out multi-step problems using minutes and hours. They have also got to grips with the fascinating Roman numeral system and looking at the rules to create any number with only 7 numerals! They have been absolutely fabulous and worked hard. In English, we have revisited passive/active and subject/object. I do believe they have now got their heads around it. They thoroughly enjoyed the round robin activity day as part of World Book Day and having their non uniform day (courtesy of Anthony) on Friday. Well done Year 6 😊

In Year 1 this week, we have been writing sentences about a woodland experience so that we can write about our own soon. We have worked super hard and we earned some hot chocolate. We have been breaking up two digit numbers counting in tens and ones. We learnt about our eyes in science. In RE we looked at the parable The Prodigal Son.

This week Year 2 have loved writing their poetry ideas for 'If I was in charge of the world'. The chocolate pencils and unicorn glue sticks are a definite request! In maths they have been exploring measures and have been using metres and centimetres to measure things around the school. They have found out more about the Easter story and begun to ask questions about the feelings of the disciples. In science they learnt about the things animals and humans need to survive and answered some super tricky questions. They had a great world book day and there was great excitement at winning some golden ticket prizes.

This week, Year 4 have showcased their amazing writing skills by 'publishing' their food chains explanations. The technical language used, sentence structures, text organisation and presentation all reflected not only their knowledge of the science topic, but the level of writing too. We have been busy bees in maths learning about fractions and lots of us have become experts in our times tables, achieving our 'gone green' certificates. World Book day has definitely been the highlight of the week - all costumes were amazing and the children thoroughly enjoyed the carousel of activities.

This week in Year 5, we have been looking at decimals, writing thousandths as decimals and fractions. In English we have continued with our balanced argument, looking at community views both for and against screen time. In History we have investigated different pieces of evidence left behind by the Mayans and drawn conclusions from them to discover what life was like.
