This week in school we have...

Year 6 have started their rehearsals for the show, they have also been helping with the props. For their fundraising they have been working on a costing spreadsheet to show what they need to buy and sell their items for. In English they have started looking at an evolutionary story called 'The Moth' – from this they will be creating their own poems.

This week in Year 1 we have started our new English unit, The Storm Whale. We have been looking at numbers to 100. In R.E we talked about how it feels to be part of something.

This week in Reception Class, we have been exploring The Highway Rat by Julia Donaldson. The children loved following the adventures of the greedy rat who steals everyone's food so much so that it made us feel hungry ourselves and made some shortbread biscuits. The children measured, mixed and shaped the dough with everybody feeling proud of their tasty creations. But then... the biscuits disappeared! Just like in the story, a sneaky thief had taken them. To help find then, we created some wanted posters to help catch the biscuit bandit and it worked! Finally, we were able to taste our delicious masterpieces.

This week, Year 4 had an amazing time on our trip to the Falmouth Maritime Museum, where we explored the Vikings as both raiders and traders. The children had a superb experience making their own Viking coins using traditional methods, trading Viking goods, and learning what made items valuable and steering boats across a pool using wind energy, just like Viking sailors! Back in class, we continued our maths learning, focusing on how to convert 12-hour clock times into 24-hour format. In RE, we've been exploring why and how people mark significant events in their lives, including special ceremonies in different religions.

This week Year 2 have been busy starting a piece of work in literacy about big cats. They have been doing some super research all around cheetahs. In maths they have finished their fractions work and are starting to look at time. They enjoyed a visit from Danielle to show them lots of African clothes and artefacts and looked great in them. They designed shields in art and created food chains in science.

Year 3 had the most fantastic time on their trip to Truro this week! There was so much to explore and learn about. At the Museum of Cornwall they were excited to discover artefacts, sound recordings, audio visuals, and hands on activities that related to all of their topic learning this year, including Stone Age tools, Bronze and Iron Age axes, an Egyptian mummy and sarcophagus, and many exhibits relating to Cornish wildlife culture and heritage. The mineral gallery was a big hit, especially with those Minecraft players who recognised lots of the rocks and crystals! In the afternoon we visited Truro Cathedral and the children were awed at the scale of the building. They enjoyed a picture treasure hunt, trying to find features of the building, and also spent some time sitting and thinking about how this sacred space made them feel.

Year 5 have had a fabulous start to the second half of the summer term. In our PE time this week, we had great fun practising for sports day...Year 5 like to be prepared...sprint relays, long distance and obstacle courses enjoyed by all. We are also particularly enjoying our new English unit of work, identifying the features of balanced arguments in texts such as 'Is screen time making children lazy?' and 'Should children have to wear school uniform?' Many excellent points have been made for both sides.
