# This week in school we have...

Year 4 have had another amazing week. In our woods session on Monday, we thought about the story of Noah and the covenant between him and God. Children then built their own 'arks' in the woods, imagining how they would feel if they were told to leave their homes and all they know. In our English lessons we have been looking at using a range of devices such as alliteration, onomatopoeia and fantastic language to engage a reader. Thursday was an absolutely amazing day as we spent the day as Egyptians dressed in costumes.

This week Year 3 have been continuing with our story of The Happy Prince and learning column addition with carrying. We have also been having deep discussions in RE. In our Tudor topic we have explored the timeline of events and continued looking at the work of Leonardo DaVinci and drawing a portrait of him. Year 6 have been very thoughtful in their learning this week: reflecting on those who gave their lives to help the many. They expressed their thoughts in beautiful watercolour poppies to make a display for our classroom. We have also started our new book, Kensuke's Kingdom, by Michael Morpurgo. We have started using the school's new English scheme, Write Stuff and their initial sequences are outstanding! Watch this space for their stories! Keep up the good work Year 6.

This week Reception Class have been making nests for their baby birds that live in the classroom and have been busy thinking and writing down ideas for their names. They also have been learning the story of the gingerbread man and practising the story in our own puppet theatre.

Year 1 have been gathering ideas for their Christmas poem and learning about the true story of Christmas from the Bible. They have also been sorting objects and materials in science and finding fact families in maths. Year 2 have been very busy doing more indepth learning and writing about the Great Fire of London. They have been working on using some amazing vocabulary as well as trying hard to use beautiful handwriting. We have also enjoyed creating fire of London artwork as well as rolling in PE and practising our amazing nativity.

Year 5 have continued with their speech writing. They have chosen powerful language in order to persuade the reader. In Maths they have built their understanding around square numbers. They have also explored different types of bullying and thought of ways to seek support both themselves and for their friends if they notice something is wrong. Great problem solving Year 5!
