## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children discover themselves, they learn about their feelings and how to make new friends. They make relationships with each other and adults and grow in confidence throughout the year. They explore new situations and how to solve problems, talk about their interests and will begin try new things.

## Physical Development

Physical development in Reception is not all about PE. The children will learn fundamental skills such as throwing and catching, kicking and rolling and practise skills such as gymnastics but, there is so much more. Children

will learn about being healthy and how to take care of themselves. They are able to handle tools with confidence and have good control and co-ordination.

## Literacy

Literacy is not all about reading and writing. Children will learn poems and songs, read new books and join in with books they already know. Children will practise their phonic skills in a variety of ways and put their knowledge into their play and work. Children will look at traditional tales that interests and excites them like the Gingerbread man, as well as newer stories that they know and love, like Supertato!

## Mathematics

Numbers all the way up to 20 will be discovered in maths. Children will learn how to recognise, write and count numbers. They will begin to share, double, add, take away and find one more and less. Shape, money, measurements and time will be looked at through everyday life.
