## Sports Report

## This week in school.....

This week in Reception, it has been *hot, hot, hot!* We've enjoyed making the most of the sunshine when it hasn't been too warm and making sure to keep cool where possible.

Our story of the week has been "What the Ladybird Heard." The children loved exploring the different characters and the sounds they make. We used these ideas to support our writing, encouraging the children to include sound words to bring their sentences to life.

Year 3 have been working really hard to calculate obtuse and acute angles this week in Maths. They have also completed some excellent writing in Literacy about Truro and its links with mining as well as creating a class acrostic poem. In History we have learnt about China Clay quarrying, and how this has changed the landscape of Cornwall. The children were fascinated to look at Google Earth and see the vast areas of China clay pits. In Science we have been exploring the formation of shadows and how they change at different points of the day. The children are also loving their rehearsals for Moanna and have done very well managing their learning with this week's heat!

This week in Year 5, we have been calculating missing angles in full turns, on straight lines, and in triangles. In RE, we explored the similarities and differences between a Progressive and an Orthodox synagogue. In English, we have begun editing and improving our fantasy stories, focusing on making our writing more descriptive and engaging.

In the heat Year 1 have been trying their best to complete their big write as well as learning about money and Mary Anning. Whilst trying to stay as cool as possible.

This week Year 2 have tried super hard despite the heat - the cold wet wipes, paddling pool and spray have helped them lots. They have explored problems in maths and written more about the savannah in literacy - it was easy to think about how the animals might behave in the heat! They have also painted and created roves in art for their African huts and had a wonderful time with Emilia's mum trying on African traditional dress.

This week Year 4 have been working really hard in maths. As part of our learning on symmetry, we investigated lines of symmetry in a range of both regular and irregular 2d shapes...ask Year 4 what we found out! We have enjoyed learning about the Viking invasions and brought this to life by learning a Viking song. In our art lessons, we have been learning about sketching techniques and have applied this by drawing Viking figure heads (the dragon at the front of Viking Longboats).

This week year 6 have been working through the story of Odysseus and the cyclops, memorising the key parts of the story and recalling it back to their group and in some cases in front of the whole class. I am very pleased to say that everyone has worked really hard on learning the story and can now re-tell it with chronological accuracy and additional oratorical flourishes to make it even more memorable. Over the coming week, we will be using this story as the basis for the children's own fictional hero who is just about to face their own challenges when starting secondary school. In between ongoing rehearsals and desperately trying to not to succumb to the raising temperatures, the children have also been exploring the contextual background to portraiture at the time of Henry VIII, focusing on his need for a male heir and seemingly unlimited wives! This will them analyse some examples of Tudor art over the next few lessons.

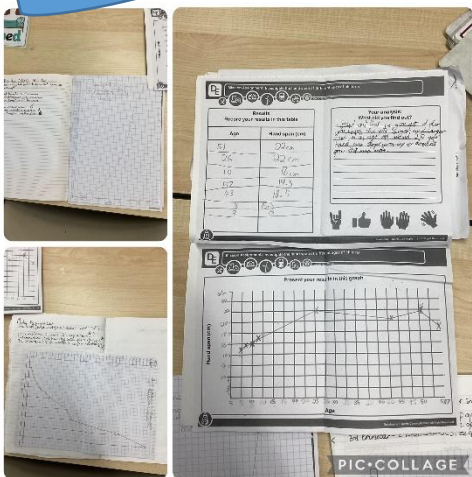
