This week in school.....

This week in Reception, the children have been working incredibly hard in phonics, applying their growing sound knowledge to their writing. In maths, we have been exploring the composition of numbers to 10, building a secure understanding of how numbers can be made in different ways. Our story of the week, The Scarecrows Wedding, has inspired lots of exciting learning opportunities. The children have thoroughly enjoyed a range of creative activities including writing invitations and wedding lists, as well as designing beautiful wedding dresses and cakes!

Year 3 have had a really interesting week! In History and Geography they learnt about Cornish smugglers and the infamous 'wreckers', exploring the reasons why smuggling was so widespread in Cornwall and some of the secrets of how goods were hidden and transported. In Maths, they have been practising their time skills, using analogue clocks to tell the time to the nearest minute. In Art they had a super messy and creative time painting seascapes, with fantastic results and in Music we have been joining in with some traditional Cornish seas shanties!

This week in Year 5, the children have been learning about the amazing work of Jane Goodall in Science, linking this to our topic on living things and their habitats. They have also been developing their maths skills by confidently converting units of measure and explaining their methods clearly. In addition, the children created their own online safety posters, promoting the strong choices people should make when using social media and online platforms.

This week Year 1, have been writing their own Grandad's Island stories. Recapping counting in 2,5 and 10s and halving and quartering. Looking at seeds in science. Learning about how we can show that other people are valuable in R.E and much more.

This week Year 2 have been magnificent mathematicians exploring different problems and working them out. They were amazing! In Science they have learnt where food comes from and drew some excellent food chains together. They have explored more about Muslims in RE and have some amazing knowledge. They also completed their art project and made their amazing African shields.

During the last week, Year 4 have had some lovely visitors from Ploughgastel, France who treated them with some of their local produce – crepes with strawberry jam and salted caramel, what a treat! We've also been working really hard on our times tables and the children have made amazing progress! Well done everyone!

Year 6 have had an amazing week. They have been designing an Island which has had whole curriculum coverage. They used: geography- atlases to decide the location, using map grid references; science – researching endangered animal as part of a conservation project; maths – working out fundraising for visitors to their Island; marketing - attracting tourism poster, landmarks etc; IT – holiday brochure. They also had a fantastic time at the pool for their fun swim. They ended the week with a teddy bear picnic/tea party! Wow what a lot they packed in again! 😊
