This week in school we have...

Year 6 have been getting to grips with prime and squared numbers in maths. They carried out an investigation looking for patterns and discovered that when you add any two prime numbers together (apart from 2) it always makes an even number. They have also been researching how Jews were persecuted because of their religion as part of their history topic. They were very reflective, and their research was very thought provoking. In Year 5 this week, we have been budding musicians. We really enjoyed singing along to Bon Jovi and playing an accompaniment to this on glockenspiels. We also braved mentioning 'Christmas' as the children evaluated stockings in preparation for making their own at the end of the term...just in time for Father Christmas to fill up! In our PE lessons, children enjoyed playing dodgeball and having a mini Olympic Games.

This week Reception Class learnt about Remembrance Day and created their own poppies and poppy log slices to make some beautiful artwork. They also started to learn more about the Nativity and created their own Christmas cards.

In Design and Technology in Year 4 this week, we experimented with different materials to see which one would be best suited for a drawstring purse. We tested each material strength, workability and how waterproof it was. We then decided that felt was the best material to use. After, we created a design brief that specified what we were creating and who it would be created for.

This week in Year 1 we have been finishing our fireworks poems. We have been continuing doing our addition in Maths as well as creating firework dances and doing some work around Remembrance Sunday. This week Year 3 have been discussing conflict in PSHE and coming up with ideas to resolve a range of scenarios. They have also been taking inspiration from our class story 'Stone Age Boy' to write about camp life in literacy and working hard to solve addition and subtraction problems with 3 digit numbers.

This week Year 2 have been doing some more learning about the Great Fire of London. They have focused really carefully about the ways people tried to stop the fire and who was to blame for the fire spreading so quickly. We even acted it out in the woods. They have also been investigating diaries in literacy and thinking about the shape of a diary. In RE we looked at images of Christians from around the world in the nativity scene and said how we knew Jesus was the king in the centre. In Science we wrote about recycling and why it was so important.
