English: Plants of the World - Reading and Research

Your English writing will link to your Geography work started yesterday. You will have today's English lesson and tomorrow's English lesson to do your research. Spend about 30 minutes on this today.

In your Topic home learning, there are a set of worksheets - Plants of the World. For this week's writing, you will need to look at pages 6, 7 and 8.

Begin by reading the challenges on the worksheets/pages 6 & 7. Choose a challenge you are interested in.

Each challenge asks children to find out about the kind of plants that can be found in a particular biome. You can use books, the internet and any other sources you have at home to carry out their research. So you may want to research the plants found in a rainforest, or a desert or even the Tundra. Just choose only one of these biomes. You will need to research the answers to these questions:

Where in the world can you find this biome?

What is the climate like in this biome?

What kind of plants might you find in this biome?

You can either use the worksheet/page 8 to write notes on (you do not need to write up your findings today). Alternatively, create your own mind map in your homework book. Please write the date and title in your book and glue the worksheet in if you write on this. This is a screen shot of the research/planning frame so you can just use the headings in your own book if you want to do your own research/planning.

Maths: Doubling numbers up to 100.

Please write today's date and title in your homework book.

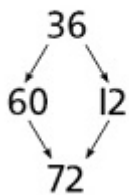
Please log on to activelearn...you will find a set of place value cards. You can either print these off and cut them out or make your own on small rectangles of paper or card. You will need to use these cards throughout the week, so please keep them safe.

If you can play this game with somebody at home it will be helpful, or you can do the activity on your own.

- 1) Shuffle the 10s cards and place these face down then shuffle the 1s cards and place these face down. They take a card from each pile to make a 2-digit number, then they work together to double the number. Repeat at least five times.

This is how we worked out how to double a number. We began by partitioning. We practised this together last term.

Double 36



$$36 \times 2 = 72$$

- 2) Maths challenge for you to try out. You can write the answers in your homework book. Please show your working out and the multiplication calculation.
What is the smallest number you can get by doubling a 2-digit number? And the largest?

Remember - doubling is the same as multiplying by 2.
