We are fortunate enough to have won the contract working for the Government delivering the vulnerable /shielding care packages for those that are not able /permitted to leave their homes during this distressing time.

We are currently delivering up to 1700 care pack deliveries per day from this depot alone. We have been asked if we can get some local children, whilst off school, or those who have any spare time to draw something cheery, a picture or a poem to place in the boxes for us to deliver to the vulnerable people.

Our drivers are constantly coming back with stories from elderly people eternally grateful for the food boxes but also for the few minutes company they have with the drivers. It's a very lonely and scary time for these people and a letter, poem, picture would maybe cheer them up. If you have any time in school with any of the children or could perhaps put a request out on your newsletter We would be extremely grateful, I don't mind my email below being put on the newsletter.

I can collect the pictures from the school when I collect Evie or alternatively they can be emailed to me on <u>tamsinlambert@bidfood.co.uk</u>, we can print them and put them in the care packs before delivering.
