This week in school we have...

Year 4 have had a busy and fun week of learning. We are really enjoying our English unit of work on 'The Iron Man' and the children are all using some amazing vocabulary. In preparation for our Ancient Egyptian Day next week, we have been finishing off our research on the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and looking at how artefacts tell us about the past. Right at the end of last week, Year 4 enjoyed visiting Coombe Woods and worked really hard to plant hundreds and hundreds of bulbs – we loved it!

This week Reception Class have been using some of their new furniture and have been finding different colours whilst playing outside. They have also been literacy stars and have been learning new words to describe. Year 6 have been examining the significance of Mary in Christianity and how she is represented in Catholicism and the Anglican Church. They have also been investigating volts in electricity and understanding the team diversity and what that means in a community. Their discussions showed a real understanding of how important acceptance of others is and how they would like to live in a tolerant and accepting world.

This week Year 3 have been doing some drama around our English unit. We also visited the woods to think about push and pull forces and in RE we have made some Rakhi bracelets.

Year 1 have been exploring everyday materials in Science, practising their pirate phonics and learning about different resources they can use to help them solve addition problems. They have also been brainstorming some adjectives to describe fireworks. Year 2 have been very busy learning and writing more about the Great Fire of London. We have explored lots of amazing vocabulary to describe what happened and the children have used words like 'devoured' and 'billowed' in their writing. In maths we have been working on number bonds and the children are amazing at working them out quickly using what they already know. We created some wonderful line drawings of London landmarks burnt in the fire and wrote about life in 1666. We did some amazing rolling with Mr Brown and have continued our photography journey. Another busy week!

Year 5 used the skills they have practising in English to help them to write their School Council speeches. Very impressive use of persuasive language! In History they have begun their information gathering about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. They have also started their music topic and enthusiastically sung and moved to Livin' on a Prayer by Bon Jovi!
