See if you can listen to, or watch, Disney's Cinderella (see links) to remind you of the story. In addition to this, listen (via the links on the school website) to the new chapters of Lady Mary that I recorded around the campfire last week for you. How do they compare? Write down all the similarities you can think of, and join them in two columns. E.g.

Cinderella

vs

Mary Tudor

1. Was born to a King and lived in a castle.

2. Cinderella's mother died.

Etc...

1. Mary's father was Henry VIII and was born in a Palace in Greenwich, London.

2. Mary's mother was divorced and was sent away.

We will then start to think how we can use this information to write an historical text! I will put something on the website on Wednesday to help you in the next stage.

Maths – Carrying on with percentages! I'd like you to have another look at comparing percentages, fractions and decimals at the link on the left.

See if you can do the examples on the screen or copy them down and do them on paper. If you get it wrong, go over them again and see if you can understand the similarities. Ask a parent to help you, or send me a message and I'll contact you! 😊
