How quickly things have changed in 5 days. We all said welcome back and happy new year on Monday and by Tuesday things had changed. We are so sad we didn't get to say goodbye to so many of the children but we hope they have watched the little video messages from their teachers. There is a sense of 'we've been here before' and so we have put in motion plans that we had ready to support the children with their home learning but also teach during the school day those children whose parents are critical workers. The big difference is that we have 95 children who qualify to attend school. We will continue to do the very best we can.

We know that there may be resources that children do not have at home that we can provide – exercise books, stationery, number squares etc. We also want to ensure that children still have access to reading books so they can enjoy reading during lockdown. We will therefore be making resources, such as reading books, available to collect from the Education Centre / Music Room on different days for each class. Resources will be available to collect between 10.00am and 2.00pm on the following days: Tuesday – Years 5 and 6 Wednesday - Year 3 and 4

> Thursday – Years 1 and 2 Friday – Reception

Please can you confirm by email the time you will be coming into school so we can ensure social distancing and safety. Hand sanitiser will be available on entry and limited numbers will be able to use the room at any one time. We hope that this will help with the home learning. If there are any additional resources that you may need please let Mrs Dunbar know and we will see if we have these available.


