Handwriting

This afternoon.... Victorian homes

Today we are going to begin investigating what Victorian homes were like, compared to our own homes. In Victorian times very rich people were known as The Upper Class, and they would have lived in very large homes or even mansions with many servants. Middle class people would have lived in homes with lots of rooms, and would also have had servants, including a cook, and a nanny to look after the children. Many people were very poor, known at the time as the Lower class. They would have lived in tiny homes with often only two rooms, which were very crowded.

Have a look at the powerpoint about Victorian homes. Perhaps you have seen houses that look like these? There are many Victorian houses in Saltash. Maybe you live in a Victorian house? Next, colour in the picture of a Victorian middle class home. While you are colouring, have a really close look at all of the different rooms and what can be seen in them. How are they different from your house today?
