This week in school we have.....

This week Year2 have been very busy learning how to use rollers to print. They have created some big patterns using this technique just like the artist William Morris. They did some amazing writing in literacy and have really tried hard to improve their handwriting and presentation. In maths we completed some tricky word problems about money and are now moving on to multiplication and division. We explored life for Victorian children in a factory and decided that we would much rather be a child today! In RE the children designed some amazing synagogues and showed so much understanding - Mrs.Oakes was super proud of them.

This week in Reception, pupils have been learning the sounds **v** and **y** during phonics sessions, alongside developing their writing skills and practising the blending of CVC words. In maths, the children have been comparing groups of numbers up to 10. As part of our Dinosaur topic, the class enjoyed a range of creative activities, using toy dinosaurs to create their own prints and pictures. In RE, the children explored different religious groups and learned that some people belong to religions such as Hinduism and Christianity.

This week in Year 1 we have been learning about how we find out about the past. We did a source hunt which was super fun. We compared Mammals and birds. We started adding within 20. We have been writing our stories about the Bear and the Piano.

This week Year three have been learning about the river Nile. We have located the Nile on a map and discovered how the Blue Nile and White Nile feed into it. The children identified ways in which the Nile was essential to the Ancient Egyptians and how it is still used today. In Art we began exploring Egyptian jewellery designs, comparing these to the Bronze and Iron Age designs from the UK that we saw last term. The children have made some beautiful drawings.

This week, Year 4 have created fabulous stories about a magical object – using the story of Aladdin as inspiration. Everyone worked their hardest – amazing. In our science lessons, we have been learning about the human digestive system and how this works. We all found it fascinating that the ‘small’ intestine is 6-7 metres long!! Wow!. We have been enjoying learning about Hinduism in RE and taken this learning into our art where we have been looking at the vibrant colour and interesting patterns seen. A super week well done.

This week in Year 5, we have been busy learning about six-digit grid references in Geography, using maps to locate landmarks and other geographical features. In History, we explored life in a Maya city, discovering what it might have been like through the sights, smells, and sounds people would have experienced. In English, we have been developing our sentence-building skills based on our class text *The Explorer*.

Year 6 have been learning how the Islam Civilisation spread across Britain this week. They have been looking at maps researching how it spread and why, eg, looking at what made trade and settlements easier across the World. They have also been writing the next instalment of their English story, looking at the differences between subordinate and coordinate clauses and how to remember them. For PE they have been looking at various indoor athletics.
