This week in school we have...

This week in Reception Class we have enjoyed a funny dinosaur story and done some writing using our phonics. We have explored 9 and 10 in our number work. We enjoyed baking some very green dinosaur biscuits and took them home to share (:) Year 5 have been fabulous actors this week using their amazing drama skills to enhance their English learning. They were stranded in the Amazon Jungle (our woods!) and had the challenge of building a raft (in a miniature version!) to use on the Amazon River to sail themselves to safety. We really enjoyed using these teeny tiny rafts in our science lesson looking at water resistance and buoyancy. Also in our science lessons this week, we created our own investigations to test the best size for a parachute. We learnt about the need for fair testing, different types of variables and the importance of completing tests more than once to ensure reliable results. We are currently enjoying exploring the topic of Judaism within RE and thinking about some thoughtful responses here.

Year 3 have launched into their Ancient Egyptian topic this week with some fun information-finding activities that got us moving and tested our powers of observation! We played a game of 'Information run', where teams battled it out to dash for information cards and share their new knowledge with their team. They then became detectives, trying to spot the deliberate mistakes in a painting of Ancient Egypt.

This week, Year 4 has been bursting with creativity and curiosity! In English, we began writing the start of our river-themed poems, bringing the flow and rhythm of rivers to life through our words. During PSHE, we explored the important question of how to stay resilient and positive when things don't go as planned, sharing thoughtful advice about goals and dreams. In Science, we wrapped up our fascinating investigation into the effects of fizzy drinks on tooth decay, drawing some eye-opening conclusions. It's been a week full of learning, reflection, and creative expression!

This week Year 2 have been super busy. In literacy they have been writing their own version of Stardust. In maths they have shown some amazing perseverance as they have tackled adding and subtracting two digit numbers . We have been very proud of their efforts. They have also explored William Morris patterns in art and carried on planning and setting up their plant experiment in science. In history they have learnt about some of the key changes that happened in Victorian times and how this affected the way people lived. This week Year 6 have worked incredibly hard in all subjects. They have mastered the Gods in Hinduism, drawn a storyboard and then retold it to their partners. They have found out about how the Arab soldiers conquered so much land so quickly in the Early Islamic Age. In English they have continued their learning about The Journey with rhetorical questions, alliteration and complex sentences.

This week Year 1 have been learning about Judaism and thinking about special messages they would like to share with the world. They have been learning of Captain Scott's journey through Antarctica and much more.
