Year 5 have enjoyed taking their maths outdoors this week...measuring objects in mm, cm and m then converting between these measurements. In our science lessons, we have enjoyed researching the gestation periods of different mammals and have made (and played) our own Top Trump cards. To finish off our history topic, we have been looking at how crimes may change over time and looked at reasons for this.

This week in Year 1 we have created some beautiful art inspired by Psalm 5. We have been learning about money and also had an exciting game of Dartmoor 3 ball and sunny woods time.

This week in Reception Class, we have made the most of the weather by having lots of fun in the sun in school and on our trip to the beach! Everyone had a lovely time building sandcastles, exploring the rockpools and enjoying the fresh sea air with their friends. We have been working hard in Maths on recognising, ordering and counting numbers up to 20. In phonics, we are continuing to develop our phonics skills by revisiting our set 2 sounds which has made us more confident in our reading and writing.

This week, Year 4 had a very exciting visit from a Viking! He shared some amazing stories about the Norse gods and even brought along some fascinating Viking artefacts, including axes and horns. The children have also been busy typing up their newspaper reports, and they look amazing. As part of our RE topic, we've also been learning about different types of weddings. This week, we explored both a Christian wedding and a Hindu wedding, comparing the traditions, clothing, and ceremonies involved in each.

Year 6 started off their week by counting their profit from the enterprise businesses. They did so well and they are researching different charities which they would like to donate some of their profits to. Rehearsals are full steam ahead for their production, it is coming together brilliantly, and they are singing and acting their hearts out. On Thursday, they had lots of fun together, enjoying time at Bounce and the swimming pool. They have made such lovely friendships, and it has been so emotional to
